

Fruit Trees

Apples – (Cross pollination - 2 apple varieties are needed to produce full crop)

Gale Gala – Firm apple with full red color with deep red striping allowing harvest in one or two pickings.

Cortland – Fruit is a beautiful red, very large, with pure white flesh. Crops are very hardy and an annual bearer.

Liberty - Medium size, yellow flesh dessert apple with 90% red over yellow background color. Resistant to apple scab, cedar apple rust, fire blight and mildew.

Golden Delicious – Fruit is medium to large and firm. The tree is spreading, productive and easy to manage. One of the best all purpose apple. Self fertile. Excellent pollen source for other varieties.

NEW Lodi– Medium size fruit. Skin is thin and tender. The flesh is white, moderately firm, crisp, tender and juicy. It is sprightly sub acid with a pleasant but not high flavor. Good for pies and sauce. Matures in late July.

NEW McIntosh – Fruit has a deep red color. Flesh white, firm, tender, very juicy, flavor characteristically aromatic, sub acid.

Tart Cherry - (Self pollinating)

Danube - The fruit of Danube® is dark red, medium to large, and sweeter than Montmorency. Planted widely in Europe, this selection is an excellent choice for the fresh market.

NEW Balaton - The fruit is large and very firm with a red juicy flesh. Trees are a late maturing tart cherry.

***NEW* Sweet Cherry- (Cross pollination - 2 sweet cherry varieties needed to produce full crop)**

Kristin – Kristin' is a mid-season, productive, large, black, high quality sweet cherry. Trees are very winter hardy.

Hedelfingen- Hedelfingen is a large, firm-fleshed, high quality, late dark red cherry of the Lambert type. The fruit is more resistant to cracking than most other cherries. The trees are early-bearing, very productive, and hardy.

Peach – (Self pollinating)

Flamin' Fury - Fruit is large, very firm and highly colored. It is hardy and is resistant to bacterial spot.

NEW Gloria – A large, highly colored yellow fleshed freestone peach. The fruit is very firm, low acid, with high sugar content and excellent dessert quality. The tree is very productive and resistant to bacterial spot.

NEW Ernie's Choice – Fruit medium to large, attractive, yellow fleshed, with some red around the pit. Tree is productive, resistant to bacterial leaf spot, and cold hardy.

****NEW** Asian Pear (Cross pollination - 2 pear varieties are needed to produce full crop)**

Hosui – This Asian variety is solid russet and ripens in late August. Fruit is mildly flavored, sweet, and juicy. Tree is vigorous and spreading. Requires thinning to attain maximum fruit size.

Atago – A brown russeted Asian pear for the late season. Fruit is large, very firm, crisp and juicy. Trees are upright, spreading and medium in vigor.

Blueberry – (Two different varieties insures pollination)

Bluecrop – Ripens early mid season. The fruit is large with excellent flavor, firmness and color.

Jersey – Late season, medium size fruit, very productive. Good flavor and is crack resistant.

Duke - Early season, high-yielding and very hardy. Berries are medium to large, slightly tart. Very Firm

Red Raspberry - (Self fertile but cross pollination improves berry size)

Boyne – Early season red raspberry that has the best winter hardiness. Medium to large size fruit with good flavor. Great for preserves.

Black Raspberry - (Self fertile)

Jewell – Large glossy fruit with great flavor. Good disease resistant

Table Grapes: (Self fertile)

Himrod – This highly-productive, seedless grape has large handsome clusters turning golden yellow when fully ripe. Clusters are loose, berries medium sized, entirely seedless, crispy sweet throughout with fine flavor.

Reliance – Red seedless, very winter hardy. Produces large clusters of round, red medium sized berries. The skins are tender and skins are melting in texture, with a sweet flavor.

Coniferous Tree Seedlings (sets of 10 seedlings)

Canadian Hemlock - Short flat needles varying from dark green to light green. Hardy, grows in a variety of soils. Prefers partial shade, will do well in full shade or sun.

White Pine - A majestic evergreen, very hardy pine grows stately and gracefully tall. Needles are soft and bluish-green in color. Makes great windbreaks and Christmas Trees.

Norway Spruce - The Norway spruce is a fast growing, dark-green spruce with short needles. Its pleasant appearance makes it ideal as an ornamental, and its growth rate is well-suited to applications such as windbreaks and privacy screens.

NEW Concolor Fir – One of the most beautiful pyramidal coniferous ornamentals. An evergreen with flat, varying soft green to deep blue needles. 1-1/2" to 2" long, bearing cones 3" to 5" long at maturity. A very hardy tree growing in a variety of well-drained soils, standing dryness and high temperatures better than other firs. .

American Arborvitae - These beautiful trees have bright green leaves in the summer. The narrow, pyramid shape makes it a natural choice for windbreaks, and they require almost no care when used as a hedge row or screen.

Colorado Blue Spruce - Most popular of all spruce for ornamental use. Color of needles ranges between dark green and silver blue, depending on the particular soil conditions. Adaptable, prefers rich, moist soil, in full sun. Also thrives on dry, well drained sites.

Deciduous Tree Seedlings (sets of 10 seedlings)

Red Oak – Acorn is 1 inch long, matures in two years. Acorns are important food for many wildlife species. Sun or partial shade.

NEW River Birch – A native birch to the river bottoms, but does well in many soils. Reddish brown exfoliating bark. Resistant to bronze birch borer.

Shagbark Hickory - Noted for its distinctive shaggy bark, this native hardwood produces edible nuts and desirable hardwood lumber.

White flowering dogwood – Striking white flowers in early spring, fruit eaten by variety of birds.

White Oak – Good for wildlife. Produces acorns. Broad, round, dense head, spreading branches and purple-red fall color. Leaves remain during winter.

Black Locust – fast-growing tree, pioneer species good for conservation, wildlife, firewood, fence posts.

Wildlife seedlings & Wildflower seed mix

Elderberry – A shrub seedling that will grow quickly into a multi-stemmed, flat-topped white flowering bush, followed by purple-black berries. Berries can be used for jellies, pies and wine. Excellent for attracting birds, and will grow in wet areas.

NEW Winterberry Holly – Height and spread 6 to 12 feet. Female plants produce bright red berries in profusion in early fall while leaves are still green and remain until mid winter after leaf drop. Likes acid soil. Will tolerate wet, swampy conditions. Native to northeastern United States. Attracts winter birds.

NEW Black Mulberry-Fast growing to a height of 30 to 50 feet. Native to North America. Abundant fruit makes this a valuable tree. The 1 inch long fruit ripens in midsummer. Prefers warm, well drained soil, but widely adaptable to many soil conditions. Fruits are a favorite of people, birds and small mammals. Mulberries produce excellent jam, jelly, juice and flavorful wine.

Butterfly bush – A fast growing shrub best in fertile, well-drained soil, however it is very drought tolerant. When in bloom, butterfly bushes are covered with blossoms in shades of white, red, pink, yellow, purple, blue and maroon and are honey scented.

Annual-Perennial seed mix - A mixture of wildflowers suited for our area, grown in NW PA. Includes bachelor's button, baby's breath, perennial lupine, larkspur, cosmos, coneflower, and many more. Will provide color for up to 5 years with some care. Seed at 8-10 lbs/acre (one ounce will seed 45-50 square feet).
