
BE ON ALERT: INVASIVE PIGWEEDS

Help Stop the Spread of These New Pigweeds







Palmer Amaranth



Waterhemp

Palmer Amaranth and Waterhemp are new pigweeds that have been found in numerous counties across Pennsylvania and in neighboring states.

- Very aggressive pigweeds that easily spread
- Resistant to glyphosate and other herbicides
- Can significantly decrease yield.
- Can double, or even triple, annual herbicide cost.

Cost

Scout Early. Scout Often.

Early identification is the key to effective management. If you are in a high-risk county, scout as often as every **three days**.

Control weeds before they reach 4 inches in height. Do not allow plants to produce seed.
