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Level I General and Related Activities

1. Identify the parts of a plant: leaf, stem, roots, flower, bud. Draw a picture and label the parts.
2. Identify the parts of a flower: petals, sepal, stamen, pistil. Draw a picture and label the parts.
3. List four things that plants need to grow. Write them on a piece of paper or notecard.
4. Read a seed packet: Find information on when to plant the seeds, the plant's sun/shade requirements, how deep and how far apart to plant the seeds, and days to harvest. Record the name of the plant and all of the information on a sheet of paper or notecard.
5. Read a plant tag: Find the name of the plant (common and latin), its preference for sun or shade, and its height. Record the information on a sheet of paper.
6. Draw a plan for your garden. First, draw the outline of the garden and then draw and label the plants. If you plan to grow plants in containers, draw the containers and plants; be sure to label all plants.
7. Visit a greenhouse, nursery, or public garden. Write down the names of at least three plants that are there and that you have never seen before.
8. Prepare and present a demonstration to your family or club. The demonstration should teach others how to do something that is related to horticulture. Examples are planting seeds, transplanting a seedling, starting plants from cuttings, harvesting or preserving plants, making a craft from plants, or using a garden tool.
