

Cloverbuds: Bubble-Mania

Things to Try at Home Bubble Trouble Go Fish Game

Materials:

- Scissors
- Bubble word card pattern
- Book: *Bubble Trouble* by Joy N. Hulme

What to do:

- Read the book, *Bubble Trouble* by Joy N. Hulme.
- Cut the word cards out.
- Shuffle or mix the cards up.
- Give each person 5 word cards to start with and place the remainder word side down in a pile between the players. This pile will be the "go fish" pile.
- The youngest player starts the game as the first player. The first player asks the next or second player on their right if they have a specific word. "Do you have the word _____."
- If the second player has the word, he or she gives the matching word to the first player.
- If the second player does not have the word, then the second player tells the first player, "I do not have _____, go fish" and the first player takes the top card on the go fish pile.
- Players take turns asking each other for word matches until all the word matches have been made and all the go fish cards in the pile are gone.

Talk about:

- Do you think the some of the words are fun to say together?
- Which words have similar sounds at the beginning and which words have similar sounds at the end?
